Originated by Seena Frost, SoulCollage® is a process for accessing your intuition and creating an incredible deck of cards with deep personal meaning that will help you with life's questions and transitions.

Looking for Coming of Age Mentors

Rites of passage marking the transition from childhood to youth run throughout history and occur in many cultures. Our UU tradition marks this transition with a program called Coming of Age (COA). This may be the UUCSV's first COA program, and I am excited to bring it to our community.

COA asks youth to reflect on what it means to be a Unitarian Universalist and how their beliefs and values intersect, all while providing a fun and safe environment in which doubt and questioning are encouraged. Our youth focus on themselves, their own spiritual journey, and how they may be involved in the greater community.

This program pairs youth with an adult mentor from the congregation, who acts on behalf of our community and guides their mentee on an inner journey of self-discovery, where one's unique gifts and insights can be claimed and brought forth into the world. The mentor will assist their mentee in crafting their own personal faith credo (credo, stems from Latin for 'I believe,' is a personal statement of faith. These credos may take the form of a written statement, original work of art, poetry, multi-media display, song, video, meditation, or any other worship element.) Ideally, in addition to helping the youth work through their credo, the mentor would also be available for general support and conversation, as well as some fun activities.

Mentors will be mature adult members from our congregation who possess a good understanding of UU'ism. They must be able to uphold appropriate sexual and emotional boundaries and be able to share their own stories and ideas in a way that youth can understand and help our youth develop their own stories and ideas. All mentors must adhere to the same standards as our RE teachers and volunteers. Mentorships will begin in November and include a two-hour mandatory training.

As you can imagine, serving as a mentor can be a very rewarding experience. If you have an interest in becoming a mentor contact Cory, our Director of Religious Education no later than October 15th.

The Traveling Chalice: Bringing the Light Home

The traveling chalice has begun

Purpose

The Purpose of the **Traveling Chalice Program** is to deepen our understanding of one of our most familiar Unitarian Universalist symbols. The light of the Chalice connects us all together and is a sacred element of our beloved community. The Chalice may also be used as a symbol of hope when one is feeling or experiencing a sense of darkness. We will learn about its history and how it brings people together through learning and love.

How the Program Works

Each week a family/household (not just those with children) will take home the **Traveling Chalice**, which will be inside a special **Chalice Box**. A sign-up sheet will be located in the Narthex at the Lifespan Faith Development counter.

You may want to use the Chalice during your meals, family meetings, or as a bedtime ritual. Choose a reading from the materials provided or make your own.

Take a photo of the chalice and post it on the UUCSV Facebook page or send it to me... (Is the Chalice on your dining room table, mantle, next to a bedside table?)

Record your experience in the included journal.

How did the chalice enrich your experience?

In what ways was the chalice used?

If you created your own reading, you may share it in the journal.

Bring the box and all of its contents back to church the following week so that the next family/household may use it.

A handmade one-of-a-kind Chalice designed and created by our very own **Dan Houston**, specifically for this program; Special Cloth, Battery Operated Candle, Votive with Wax Candle, Pen, Journal, Chalice Lighting Readings, and a book titled **A Cup of Light: All About the Flaming Chalice** by Pamela Baxter.
